MARKET COMMENT A2019

I would like to begin this report by commending our producers for the resilience they have shown through such very difficult growing conditions to be able to produce such quality Mohair.

Once again our offering at the June 21st Sale was highly praised by all buyers in attendance. Especially in relation to the standard of preparation and the quality of the offering taking into account the extreme seasonal conditions.

Continuing buoyant International demand combined with low international and domestic supply, has once again seen significant price gains especially for the fine and medium sectors of the market. The Sale average of \$25.40/Kg for the 31,272 kilos offered was a great result.

Kid types were up on average 15.6% with the top price being \$45.20/Kg for a line of BSFK testing at 25.4 microns and purchased by Stucken. Young goat types were keenly sought after and were up an average of 12.4% with the equal top price of \$36.00/Kg paid for two lots BSFFYG at 28.5 micron and CFFYG at 28.2 micron both purchased by Sudwolle Pty Ltd. Adult types were also up in price by an average of 5.9%. The top price was paid by Stucken for the CFFH lot which tested at 31.6 micron and had one of the best yields of the offering being 81.3%. This line sold for \$28.50/Kg. The better STNS and SCOTS were also keenly sought after with fineness again being the major contributing factor to the high prices. FCOT made \$34.60/Kg and the FSTN made \$30.00/Kg.

After the Auction and post Auction negotiations have been finalised and a 100% clearance was achieved. The A2019 auction produced a very successful outcome for all producers involved.

Weaving Type Consignment Essentials

Producers participating in the weaving type project are reminded that when you consign your fibre, whether it is in bales, butts or bags that may also contain non-weaving type fibre, it is ESSENTIAL to have these components clearly physically marked on your bales, butts, bags etc and clearly noted on any accompanying paperwork or consignment note. Wherever possible please place weaving type at the top of the bale or butt and consolidate bags of individual fleeces into a separate larger bag. This will significantly reduce the time for classers to separate this fibre from pooled fibre. Samples must be taken of each fleece EVERY TIME you consign and either submitted direct to Southern Tablelands Fibre Testing or include them with your consignment in a separate bag clearly marked 'SAMPLES FOR TESTING'.

Weaving type fibre and non-weaving type fibre need to be separated and clearly marked as you can appreciate they need to be treated differently. It is time consuming for staff if they get to the bottom of a bale that is assumed to be all pooled fibre and find a layer of weaving type. Weights then need to be adjusted and the fibre separated for classing with the weaving type.

Strapped for cash? Need money before the sale date?

Do you know we have a process whereby smaller producers may choose to have clips up to 50kg purchased on delivery to the AMMO warehouse. This will help us with our accounting process and will give these producers the opportunity to get payment for their mohair sooner. Purchase prices will be advised on delivery, but will usually be no more than 80% of the previous sale price, less the usual charges. This pre-purchase will be an option only, not mandatory so there will always be an option to wait until the pool is sold. We see this as a benefit to smaller producers who may not wish to wait for their sale proceeds until the next AMMO pool.

We also offer **advance payments** for consignments delivered to receival centres prior to the closing date for a sale. An advance payment of **\$4/kg** on the gross weight delivered, will be made to producers who consign on their request (tick the box on your consignment note or contact the office direct) Payment will be made either by cheque or direct payment in accordance with the producer's existing payment instructions.

MOHAIR PREPARATION ON-FARM

PREPARATION OF STAINS

Whilst it is essential to remove ALL stained fibre from your fleeces/fleece lines, there is more that needs to be done. Classing or sorting of lines of stain must be approached in a very similar way as you would in classing fleece lines.

The fundamentals are the same i.e. Uniformity of length, age of the animals and the degree of staining are the most important characteristics.

The most common stain lines are STN—Light stain or yellowing, and LOX—Heavy stain and including light faecal contamination. You should aim to keep your stain lines uniform for the degree of stain or discolouration. Mixed lines of stain are difficult if not impossible and time consuming to separate and may result in the down-grading of the entire line.

There is a huge difference in price between STN and LOX e.g. In November 2018 sale STN made 1960c/kg and LOX made 540c/kg so as you can see it is very beneficial to sort stains correctly and keep them as uniform as possible. The lines we currently use for stains are:-

FSTN—Fine light stains, minimum length 90mm and a max of 30 micron.

STN—Pen stain, light urine and tip stain, minimum length 50-80mm

LOX—Medium to Heavy stains Minimum 90-100mm Max 36 micron

DLOX—Medium to Heavy stain minimum 50-80mm Max 36 micron

STNSDY—All age groups Light to Heavy stain with 1% to 6% vegetable matter.

NOTE: Dags or hard cots must NOT be placed into strain lines. This type of fibre is NCV. (No Commercial Value)

Dags should be removed from fleeces during the skirting process on farm but please do not consign dags or mix them through lines.

Lice control in Angora Goats

Eradication of lice is essential for Mohair production. First you need to determine which lice you have and any treatment to be given to all goats on the property. Different products will have different efficiency depending on how much fleece is on the goats. Dips and back lines are only effective on animals three weeks off shears. Oral and inject able lice treatments have a similar efficacy. Regardless the amount of fleece on the goat. Pyrethrins and synthetic pyrethroids are effective against both types of lice and are available as a dip or pour on. Ivermectin doramection and moxidecton are effective against sucking lice and only partially against biting lice. These are available as a pour on and subcutaneous injection.

Drenches containing these drugs do not treat lice. Fipronil a product contained in cat and dog spot on treatments is also effective against lice. Regardless of the treatment used no product is completely effective against eggs and nits. For this reason repeat treatment in 10 - 14 days is recommended.

Remember a lot of products are not registered for use in goats. Take to your Vet. (Full article available from the office)

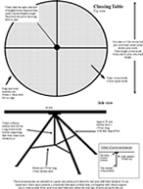
