MARKET COMMENT A2020

AMMO Ltd.'s first sale for 2020 was conducted in Narrandera on the 6th March. The result was generally very pleasing with an average sale price of \$ 24.76/kg and a 100% clearance achieved.

Trends

Fine Kid and Fine Fine Kid types up 5.5 to 6% on average. Top prices achieved, BSFK \$48.15/kg, CFK \$46.20/kg and CFFK \$45.00/kg. Young Goat types generally unchanged or were slightly in buyer's favour. Adult types down marginally on previous sale prices. There was downward pressure on lines above 32/33 microns.

Surprisingly, average microns for similar types this sale were about 2 microns stronger. The stronger micron tests may have been a result of the extended period of hand feeding as a result of the ongoing drought.

The next AMMO auction will be held on Friday the 11th September 2020, with a closing date for receivals being the end of May. So be sure to prepare your mohair on farm to the best of your ability and then consign as soon as possible after preparation is complete.

Smaller producers may choose to have clips up to 50kg purchased on receival at the AMMO warehouse. Price will be advised on delivery. This pre-purchase will be an option only, not mandatory so there will always be the option to wait until the pool is sold. We see this as a benefit to smaller producers who may not wish to wait for their sale proceeds until the next AMMO pool.

We also offer **advance payments of \$4/kg** for consignments delivered to the Narrandera Warehouse prior to the closing date of a sale. Either tick the box on your consignment note or contact the office direct. Payment will be made either by cheque or direct payment in accordance with the producer's existing payment instructions.

ON-FARM PREPARATION

I know I probably sound like a broken record but....

The benefits of very good on-farm preparation should never be underestimated.

The benefits to you the Producer and more importantly the broader Industry should always be uppermost in your mind when classing/sorting your mohair.

It has taken 6 months to produce, so it is of the utmost importance to invest as much time into your preparation as you can.

Note: Whether you fully class your mohair or just skirt your fleeces always ensure at least all fleeces are free from stains, short pieces, clumpy veg fault and any cotted portions.

The better your mohair is prepared on farm, the better the product AMMO offers to the World. Maintaining and improving on our reputation will enhance the possible return to us all.

Lice control in Angora Goats

Eradication of lice is essential for Mohair production. First you need to determine which lice you have and any treatment to be given to all goats on the property. Different products will have different efficiency depending on how much fleece is on the goats. Dips and back lines are only effective on animals three weeks off shears. Oral and injectable lice treatments have a similar efficacy regardless the amount of fleece on the goat. Pyrethrins and synthetic pyrethroids are effective against both types of lice and are available as a dip or pour on. Ivermectin, doramectin and moxidectin are effective against sucking lice and only partially against biting lice. These are available as a pour on and subcutaneous injection. Drenches containing these drugs do not treat lice. Fipronil a product contained in cat and dog spot on treatments is also effective against lice. Regardless of the treatment used no product is completely effective against eggs and nits. For this reason, repeat treatment in 10 - 14 days is recommended. Remember a lot of products are not registered for use in goats. Take to your Vet. (Full article available on AMMO website)

Producers must also ask for some form of receival documentation when the mohair is left and a call or email to the AMMO office to let us know that mohair

has been consigned would be appreciated.

National Angora Trophy Show Goulburn March 2020

The general quality of the Angoras and mohair fleeces was very high. All breeders should be commended for their dedication and resilience shown in producing such high quality mohair under such difficult climatic conditions. After such an extremely difficult 2019 it is pleasing to see the positivity re-emerging on the back of stable mohair prices. Some welcome rainfall and the likely prospect of good rainfall for the medium to long term will also give producers some extra confidence. A weekend such as 'NATS' is a very useful networking platform with both local and overseas producers in attendance. We need to work together to make our Industry grow.

Craig was invited to attend the NATS in Goulburn held on the 13th, 14th and 15th March to class and value fleeces for the Mohair Production Championship and as one of the four judges for the new 5kg commercial blended fleece kid class. AMMO was well represented over the weekend with AMMO Chairperson Brett Grant and Vice Chairman Peter Simpson also attending.



Once again Craig Clancy was invited to Class and value the entries in the Mohair Production Championship. Teams entered comprised 2 kids and 2 yearlings (animals entered could be either wethers or does) The winning team entered by Culbookie was valued at \$560.44. The second place team entered by Koorana Angoras was valued at \$493.48 with the third place entry Dulark Angoras valued at \$452.48.
